Sharia (/ ˈʃɑːrɪə /), Sharia law, or Islamic law (Arabic: شريعة إسلامية [ʃaˈriˈiːa]) is a religious law forming part of the Islamic tradition. It is derived from the religious precepts of Islam, particularly the Quran and the Hadith. In Arabic, the term شريعة sharʿ refers to God's immutable divine law and is contrasted with فقه fiqh, which refers to its human scholarly interpretations.

Sharia states: Until 1999, Islamic law applied primarily to civil matters, but twelve of Nigeria's thirty-six states have since extended Sharia to criminal matters. Sharia courts can order amputations, and a few have been carried out. The twelve sharia states are Zamfara, Bauchi, Borno, Gombe, Jigawa, Kaduna, Kano, Katsina, Kebbi, Niger, Sokoto and Yobe.
